Pastor Randy and Holly live at Elmore in Spearfish Canyon and would like to share a historical presentation that was presented to the community at the Senior Center recently. Randy has compiled some great information and historical photos. The program will be from 5-6 p.m. on Thursday May 22.. Elmore was a small community in the Canyon that has rich history in the train and mining history. Its beginnings were in the 1880's as a logging and mining camp, and the town has a rich train history. Elmore had a train depot, a school, a general store, and a post office at one time.. — Pastor Randy

FOOD PANTRY REPORT: Many thanks to our workers Shirley B, Marcie N, Darlene P, Connie T, Dana E, Lorie U, Glenn U, Ian U, and John Daum – our outdoor guy!

We served 6 times in very cold and some sunshine weather! There were a total of 105 families who gave us a breakdown of 64 people over 60 years old, 120 people who were ages 19 to 59, and 72 people who were under 18 years old. For all of March, there were 303 families—23 of them new to the pantry—and 759 people. We are finding we have more families who don't use the pantry every month – they only use it when they really need it!

There are no paid people working at the pantry – all volunteers! Twelve churches work the pantry. The average number who come to the pantry each month is 300 families or 749 people. This is about a 65 people / 25 families increase over last year's numbers.

The pantry receives “leftover” items from WalMart and Safeway twice a week. We buy from Feeding South Dakota and our local stores. Our income consists of all donations and some grants. The Post Office and Scouts of America have big food drives each year, and some school kids and organizations (like us!) help with food drives as well.

Items that are always welcome are cereal, soup, canned vegetables and fruit, crackers, hamburger helper, macaroni and cheese, and ramen noodles. If you'd like to donate, you can take your donation directly to the Food Pantry or leave it in the shopping cart in the Fellowship Hall and someone will take it to the Food Pantry for you.
